MBI CHAIR REPORT - September

Concept Nine: Able, trusted servants, together with sound and appropriate methods of choosing them, are indispensable for effective functioning at all service levels.

Spiritual Principle: Ability

Who reserved that room and provided a format for the monthly MBI step workshop? Who organized the annual MBI retreat? Who is the Treasurer for MBI? For Region 6? For worldwide OA? Who develops the websites for the Intergroups, Region, OA.org?

Nearly all of the above are accomplished by OA members doing or giving service. For group meetings, some willing members serve as Greeters or Key holders. Members step up to oversee a group's literature supply and others to be responsible for the 7th tradition. Each of these service positions requires some ability, some more defined than others, and each group defines the duties for each position. Each group also, by means of group conscience, determines any abstinence or other requirements for the service positions at the group level. Some members give service by serving as a Representative "Rep" from the group meeting to the Mass Bay Intergroup monthly meeting.

Intergroups also identify service positions, the duties involved and then, in the Mass Bay (or any other) Intergroup bylaws, any requirements for and election or appointment process for positions. The Mass Bay Intergroup Bylaws identify at least the following service positions: Chair, vice Chair, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, and Recording Secretary. There are also committee Chairperson positions for the 12th step within,

Public Information/Media and Professional outreach committees.

There is no formal application process for any of these positions but there are requirements and elections for Board positions. Keeping up the MBI Website, oambi.org, requires specific computer skills and so members with such skills fill such roles easily when they can. However, when there is no member with computer skills available, willing, abstinent OA members have come forward to do and learn what they can. These members have seen their skills grow and their abstinence strengthened by working through something beyond what they thought themselves capable of. For me, this experience parallels abstinence and recovery. I lack the ability to abstain from compulsive eating myself. However, with willingness, I can show up and learn from others. This has resulted in the new ability to abstain, one day at a time.

Region 6 service operates similarly. Intergroup bylaws outline the requirements for and election process of Reps to the Region 6 business assemblies, held twice each year. Region 6 then has Bylaws to define the "board" positions and requirements for service on the board. The Region 6 bylaws define the purpose of each committee.

It is a pleasure to read the applications of members for Region and World service positions. The members are asked to "qualify" as candidates for board positions by sharing, in writing, their personal OA story. The applications also include a place to document specific skills and/or related experience they have for the particular service position. Understandably, in addition to their personal OA story, applications for Treasurer often include education, professional and unpaid experience with banking, money management,

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budgeting or accounting. There are also applications which show a member's growth into a service position. The willing, abstinent OA member whose service to their group meetings, then Intergroup, and Region sometimes "grows" into a humble, trusted, effective leader who applies for the Region 6 vice Chair or Chairperson position.

There is a saying, "Higher power does not call the equipped, but does equip those called." Please consider growing in service with a different type of service to your group, Intergroup, Region and/or Worldwide OA.

MBI Treasurer's Report July 2019

For July, \$37 of our income was from the 7th Tradition collection at our MBI meeting. \$18 was paid for Newcomer packets and \$12 for literature. \$1175 was from MBI Fall Retreat registrations. \$2159.57 was from group donation(s). The list of groups who donated in July is at the end of this report. **Thanks to all of you who are supporting MBI.**

Our July expenses: Saintly Solutions was paid \$11.05 for web site hosting; Jeanne K. was paid \$50 for her June website work; Marina was paid \$82.50 for her work between 6/17 and 7/4, and \$75 for her work from 7/9 to 7/18; we paid Lawrence Memorial Hospital \$25 for hosting our 7/20 MBI meeting, and \$25 for

the Step Workshop on 7/27; our Verizon bill was \$156.38; our monthly office rent was \$455; we paid the Post Office \$2.65 for postage (Professional Packets); Lowes was paid \$5.06 for 2 office keys; OA.org was paid \$11 for pamphlets. We paid Tsoutsouras & Co., PC \$982 for preparing our taxes for 2018 (they do give us a \$200 discount on their services).

Our Checking balance includes \$4754 of retreat registrations including \$53 in contributions for scholarships.

Step 9 "Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.

"The series continues with discussion of Step Nine. Both speakers describe their own personal experience with doing Step Nine, giving specific examples of amends they have made. In addition, they emphasize the need to make amends in order to refrain from returning to compulsive eating, and to be released of the negative feelings or turmoil created by holding on to the amends. Also discussed is reviewing the list and practicing amends with a sponsor, remembering the principles of forgiveness and love for others, and that the focus of the amends should be on one's own role and behavior, being specific and actually making amends and changes. Suggestions are also provided for making amends to people who have died or are no longer in one's life. The second part of Step Nine is also stressed, ensuring that no further injury or insult occur due to inappropriate amends. <u>Listen Now - Step Nine</u> | <u>Download</u>

NEW! OA Abstinence and Recovery Definitions Updated definitions of

"abstinence" and "recovery" in Overeaters Anonymous were adopted at the 2019 World Service Business Conference. The revised policy states: The WSBC 2019 accepts the following definitions: Abstinence: The act of refraining from compulsive eating and compulsive food behaviors while working towards or maintaining a healthy body weight. Recovery: Removal of the need to engage in compulsive eating behaviors. Spiritual, emotional, and physical recovery is achieved through working and living the Overeaters Anonymous Twelve Step program. (Business Conference Policy Manual, 1988b [amended 2019])




1. How did you hear about OA *Check all that apply.


2. How long have you been a member of OA? *Mark only one oval.


3. What is your length of abstinence? * Mark only one oval.


4. Do you currently have a sponsor? * Mark only one oval.
