### MBI Chair Report- August 2016

### "Overeaters Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers" (OA Tradition Eight).

Greetings! Considering Tradition Eight for this month, I was prompted to check out our OA 12 and 12 book for guidance. One of the first points made regarding this tradition was that we give freely to each other our experience, strength, and hope. There is no paycheck for the service we do in leading meetings, setting up the room, putting away chairs, ordering literature, and scheduling speakers.

We are having a retreat this October 7-9 at the Espousal Center in Waltham and all the arrangements, getting the word out, and organizational details are being done without pay by members of our MBI fellowship. The World Service Convention in Boston will be organized and produced almost entirely through the free service of our fellowship. That is extraordinary! We come together and work to spread the work and reach out to those who still suffer. However, our traditions tell us it is appropriate to have "paid employees ... to take care of the business of OA in the intergroup offices" (OA 12 & 12, p. 172). This is important because sometimes we do not have the time or skills necessary to fulfill some responsibilities. Currently, you support with your contributions an extraordinary part-time office manager (Pat) and a skilled webmaster (Jeanne K). We are blessed by the work these two women do supporting us in getting the word out to our

intergroup and beyond. We thank them for their service.

Financially, we are sound – paying our bills and meeting our financial commitments to Region 6 and World Service. We are fortunate to have an excellent treasurer who manages our money and keeps our integrity in regard to our finances. It is critical for the integrity of our intergroup to have our monetary affairs in order. Thank you, Jean B for your service!

We have exciting happenings coming up in the near future – World Service Convention, September 1-4 at the Boston Marriott Copley Place, our MBI Retreat, October 7-9 at the Espousal Center in Waltham, and our annual Thank-a-thon on Thursday, November 24<sup>th</sup> at the Lawrence Memorial Hospital in Medford. I encourage you to participate, join in the fellowship and share your recovery.

The chapter on Tradition Eight ends with this inspiring statement: "When we keep OA's eighth tradition, we discover a beautiful spirit of caring service which becomes a powerful factor in our healing" (p. 176). Thank you for your service and support in so many ways for the health and vitality of the OA fellowship and your never failing commitment to those who still suffer from this debilitating disease. As usual, I invite you to come and join our intergroup. There is a lot of work to do!

### MBI Treasurer's Report – June 2016

Income for June was a little complicated. We took in 1713.65 in group donations (see list of donor groups at the end of this report, we are very grateful) plus 37.00 in sales of newcomer packets, 14.00 from the workshop, and 15.00 from the MBI 7<sup>th</sup> tradition collection. At the beginning of June, however, much of that income had not yet arrived and we had an expense due (our share of the booth from the family physicians a few months ago) so I transferred 1000.00 from our savings account (prudent reserve) to make sure we'd have enough to cover our bills.

Our expenses for June included our usual for office rent, donation for the MBI meeting (in lieu of rent), paying Pat, our wonderful office worker, and our bill for phone/internet. Other costs were 17.50 for website, 498.00 to Metro West to repay our half of the booth as noted above, 144.12 for office supplies, 106.00 for our annual PO box rent, 50.00 for webmaster, 25.00 donation to the hospital for the workshop, 40.44 to Sally for printing (includes 16.71 from a check written last October and never cleared) and 20.00 for ink and paper reimbursement (to Jean for printing). So, yes, the expense side was a little complicated too.

The good news is we still have money and July donations are coming in well. For expenses, July will have our quarterly donations to World Service and Region 6 and I heard from our accountants that our returns are in the mail to us for signatures (as a nonprofit we don't pay taxes but file reports with the feds and the state) which means a bill will also be coming soon. It is unclear if we will have expenses associated with the World Service convention, but we have the resources if we do.
