MBI Chair's Report - June 2015

One of the roles of the intergroup is to provide services and information to the fellowship in MBI. Your intergroup has been engaged in several projects to reach out to those who are still suffering and to keep our fellowship informed. Our intergroup meetings are filled with thoughtful reflection, enlivening discussions and a commitment to take action. I remember when I first came into program, someone shared with me that one of the keys to abstinence was to be willing and to take action. That description reflects the MBI Intergroup – a fellowship of people willing to serve and take action.

Some of these projects include: The Flyer Project, Professional Outreach Packets, PSAs' in local towns, and Designated Downloaders for each meeting to bring information to you from the Intergroup, Region 6 and World Service. You can read about and be updated about these developments in this newsletter.

World Service is publishing an excellent **OA News** <u>Bulletin</u> (Ctrl + Click to follow the link) which this month includes a new revised version of the OA Preamble, sample templates for suggested formats for various types of meetings, information on the Outreach Poster

Campaign and some new podcasts. You can sign up for this newsletter and receive it monthly.

The presenters for the July 11th event, *Coming Back to OA: A New Beginning-Part II – "I am abstinent, now what?"* have agreed to speak and are ready to share how the signs of relapse, OA tools and the Steps support them in their ongoing recovery. We are grateful for their service and willingness to participate in the event. All are welcome and we want to reach out especially to those in the fellowship who have not been around and invite them to come. You can find more details in this newsletter.

Other plans we are investigating are a workshop on designing and implementing a strategic plan for MBI, a day and/or weekend retreat, increasing the number of representatives we send to region 6 assembly and delegates to the World Service Business Conference, redesigning the website and exploring outreach activities to reach those still suffering.

Motion to be voted on at the July 19, 2015 meeting:

There is a motion that will be voted on at the July 19 MBI meeting proposed by Pat C (Westford): "Delegates to World Service must be abstinent for a minimum of one year continuously prior to date of submitting qualifications" (Currently, the abstinence requirement is three years).

The Region 6 Convention is being held in Hartford, CT October 23-25. Helen has raffle tickets to raise money for this (\$1 a ticket, 6 for \$5): first prize is convention registration and your hotel room. Winners will be announced at Fall Assembly.

Region 6 is also encouraging groups to donate themed baskets to be raffled at the convention. So many of you contributed generously and were so creative for the Burlington convention (thank you!!)- please consider doing it again!

MBI Treasurer's Report - May 2015

Expenses exceeded income -\$1051.33

May was expensive, but it usually is with bills from Region 6 and World Service.

Our income was a bit lower than average and the expenses higher. We received \$892.20 in group donations, \$10 for MBI 7th tradition, and \$15 for sale of newcomer packets. A list of groups donating appears at the end of this report, thank you to our faithful donors who keep MBI able to serve our members and reach out to those still struggling.

Our routine monthly expenses for office rent, MBI meeting rent, Verizon for phone and Internet, and pay for Pat our wonderful office worker were the usual amounts. Additional expenses were 12.50 for website, 37.20 for OA literature, 15.55 for postage (paid by Jean for stamps and sending tax info to our accountants), and Helen's charges for Region 6 and World Service which were 914.53 for WSO (hotel, food, etc. not including airfare) and 185.73 for R6 for mileage and 12.25 for tolls.

We should not have any major expenses in June. In July we make our quarterly donations to R6 and WSO of 250 each. August is also usually pretty quiet. In the fall we have another round of quarterly donations, the Region 6 fall assembly, the bill from the accountants and closer to the end of the year we have our insurance renewals. This list does not include any events we have planned as an intergroup or participation in any outside events like health fairs or conventions. We have not had to tap into our prudent reserve and I would like us to try to keep it that way.
